Check-in:

-To exhibit in this department, bring the item(s) to be exhibited to Kenwood Hall on Wednesday, August 4th, between 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Change for 2021...Floriculture and Horticulture Divisions MUST be entered on Monday, August 2nd, between 7:00 and 10:00 a.m.

Check-out:

-All exhibits must remain on display until 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 7th. **NO EARLY RELEASES.** Any exhibitor who removes an entry early will forfeit his/her premium check and will not be allowed to exhibit for three years.

-Kenwood Hall will close at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday. Exhibits will be ready for release at 7:00 p.m.

-Exhibits and premium checks must be picked up in Kenwood Hall between 7:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. on Saturday. Pick up your premium check **BEFORE** picking up your exhibits. All exhibits must be checked out with the division superintendents or assistants before removal.

-If needed, entries may be picked up Sunday from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m. in Kenwood Hall (front/east door only). After that, arrangements must be made with the Fair Office (fairoffice@saline.org) to pick up items. Any remaining items will be disposed of after Aug. 31st.

Reminders:

-Any entry that has previously received a ribbon at the Tri-Rivers Fair cannot be entered again.

-Only one entry per class allowed (in EVERY division).

-4-H members may NOT enter Division 20 Youth 17 & Under.

-No professionals (anyone with a sales tax number or who teaches) may enter, unless otherwise stated.

Best of Show – Rosette Ribbon (sponsored by the Tri-Rivers Fair Board)

All entries must have been preserved since the last Tri-Rivers Fair.

Previous Best of Show winners are not eligible to win Best of Show for one year.

Recipes and processing methods from the sources below must be used. Recipes must be from 1995-present and must be adjusted for altitude based on your processing location or it will be disqualified. Processing methods that will be disqualified include: open kettle- canning, oven canning, sun canning, and using electric multi-cookers. For more information on electric multi-cookers, see http://nchfp.uga.edu/publications/nchfp/factsheets/electric_cookers.html. Untested recipes will be disqualified for food safety reasons. Each exhibit must be sealed in a clean, clear, standard canning jar, with matching brand two-piece lids. No colored jars, fancy padded lids, fabric over wraps or cozies. No fancy packs unless recipe states to do so (ex: pickled asparagus). For food safety reasons, the size of jars used must not be larger than the jar size stated in the recipe. Note: There are 12-ounce, 24-ounce, and 28-ounce canning jars available and may be used. Use pint jar process recommendations for 12-ounce jars. Use quart jar process recommendations for 24 ounce and 28-ounce jars.

Each exhibit must have the complete recipe and instructions attached with the entry card or it will be disqualified. Recipe must include exhibitor name, recipe source, date of publication, and altitude where it was processed. If using Mrs. Wage's or Ball mixes, indicate the date the mix was purchased. Alcohol is not allowed as an ingredient in food preservation entries. Dried products must also include the recipe, preparation steps, and heating instructions. All meat jerky must be heated to an internal temperature of 160 degrees F before or after drying. This is not the drying temperature. Jerky not heated to an internal temperature of 160 degrees F will be disqualified. Heating information can be found in "Dry Meat Safely at Home" www.ksre.ksu.edu/bookstore/pubs/MF3173.pdf. **Use a rubber band to attach the entry card and recipe around the top of the jar.**

Each jar must be labeled with the following: product, name of exhibitor, method of preservation, processing time, pressure (psi), altitude where processed, date processed (month and year). The label must not cover brand name of jar. Do not write on the jars or lids, only on the labels.

Entries not adhering to the rules will NOT be judged.

Example: Canned Fruit must be four (4) different types of fruit.
