

# 2021 REQUIREMENTS FOR KANSAS COUNTY FAIRS LIVESTOCK

## GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All animals are subject to examination by the exhibition staff or their representatives, and shall be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease. Animals determined by exhibition staff to have not met listed requirement will not be permitted to exhibit. Health certificates are not required except for 4-H Horses or animals from outside of Kansas.

### CATTLE AND BISON

The Kansas Animal Health Department (KAHD) requires no test on cattle and bison of Kansas Origin. Cattle determined by exhibition to have lesions of ringworm, warts or infested with mange will not be permitted to exhibit.

### POULTRY

All poultry, except waterfowl, must show proof that they are pullorum – typhoid clean by one of the following methods:

- Originate from a U.S. Pullorum – Typhoid clean flock as evidenced by an official VS Form 9-2, certifying all birds in the flock over 4 months of age have had a negative test for pullorum – typhoid within the past year.
- Present evidence that the entries were purchased from a U.S. Pullorum – Typhoid clean source and have been the only poultry on the premises (*Presentation of a VS 9-3 Form received when poultry were purchased*).
- Present an official VS 9-2 Form, signed by an official testing agent showing the entries have had a negative pullorum – typhoid test within the proceeding 90 days.

### Pullorum-Typhoid (PT) Testing for Chickens

Kansas continues to be a Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T) Clean State, which means that all poultry (except waterfowl, pigeons, and market broilers less than 90 days of age) involved in exhibitions, such as the county fair, are **REQUIRED** to test negative on a pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition.

This year, Central Kansas District will be providing an opportunity for you to get your chicken tested.

If you cannot make this opportunity, testing your chicken will be your responsibility.

Remember that **NO** waterfowl or pigeons need to be tested. Market broilers **LESS THAN 90** days old do not require testing.

# OPEN CLASS

## AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT

### DIVISION 3 – POULTRY

Superintendent.....

Entry Fee \$1.00 per class will be collected

1. All standard breeds will be shown by breed
2. Poultry must be banded to insure proper identification. Bands are available from the superintendent..
3. Poultry shown must be tested and shown free of pullorum-typhoid diseases. Testing may be done 90 days prior to time of entry or cooping but after 90 days the bird needs to be retested. Proof of test results are due at entry time.
4. Entries must be inspected for mites and lice before being placed in cages. **If a bird is brought to the fair with lice, etc. it needs to be treated at that time or taken home. It should not be placed in cages until it is treated.**
5. Please specify class, breed ( Rhode Island Red, Belgium Quail, Plymouth Barred Rock, etc.), variety, age (young or old) and sex on entry card.
6. Poultry will be grouped by breeds.
7. **Judging will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, (birds need to be cooped 1 hour before judging begins)**
8. Poultry will be judged according to the APA Standards.
9. Pre-entries due Friday before the Fair to Superintendent. Pre-entries will have priority for cages as limited number exist.
10. Birds need to be cooped 1 hour before judging begins. **No bird can be cooped without checking in with the superintendent and the entry cards are matched with each bird.**
11. **Tuesday before fair poultry can be entered from 3-7 p.m.**
12. Exhibitor is expected to feed and water their own birds (Exhibitor is expected to provide adequate water dish for each pen.)

- 901 Standard Breeds, Large Fowl - Old pen.

- 902 Standard Breeds, Bantams - Young pen.

- 904 Production Pullets - 3 pullets to be judged on egg production qualities only.
  - a. Standard Bred b. crossbred
- 905 Production Hens - 3 hens to be judged on egg production qualities only.
  - a. Standard Bred b. crossbred
- 906 Dual purpose pullets; Pen of 3 Such as Rhode Island Reds, New Hampshire, Plymouth Rocks, etc
- 907 Dual purpose hens; Pen of 3 Such as Rhode Island Reds, New Hampshire, Plymouth Rocks, etc.
- 908 Meat-type Chickens - 3 birds of the same sex to be judged on meat production qualities only.
  - a. Standard Bred b. crossbred
- 909 Turkeys - all breeds 910 Ducks - all breeds
- 911 Geese - all breeds
- 912 Other Fowl, all breeds

Awards - Rosettes for Best and Reserved of each group (ie. American, Asiatic, etc.).

## **DIVISION 4- FIELD CROPS**

All exhibits must be in place by 3:00 p.m. Monday, August 2. No sample awarded a prize in this department in former years will be eligible for entry this year. All entries shall have been grown by the exhibitors and entered by the exhibitor.

### **- WHEAT -**

All exhibits in the wheat classes shall consist of 1 gallon of wheat grown by the exhibitor in current year. All entries must be under the variety name. Entries are allowed a 2 1/2" to 3" diameter cone to limit grain to about 3 quarts. Premiums: 1st place, \$3.00; 2nd place, \$2.00; 3rd place, \$1.00.

Class 1 - Wheat (variety must be named)

Class 2 - Soybeans (1 gallon)

Class 3 - Soybeans (bundle of 5 plants)

Class 4 - Hybrid Grain Sorghum (5 heads)

Class 5 - Hybrid Corn (5 ears)

Class 6 - Alfalfa Hay (4" slice)

Class 7 - Brome Hay (4" slice)

Class 8 - Prairie Hay (4" slice)

Class 9 - Bermuda Hay (4" slice)

Class 10 - Oil Seed Sunflowers (1 gallon)

Class 11 - Oil Seed Sunflowers (3 heads)

Class 12 - Oats (1 gallon)

Class 13 - Alfalfa Seed (1 gallon)

Class 14 - Brome Grass Seed (1 gallon)

Class 15 - Miscellaneous Crops - Exhibit to consist of one gallon sample of seed. Variety must be named.
