Saline County Fair Association TRI-RIVERS FAIR Rules & Regulations for Art Show

1. Booth spaces are 10' x 8'. Each booth will be provided with a back drapery and can be provided one table and one chair, must be marked on contract. In accordance with our decorator's policy, exhibitors may not pin, staple, or tape anything to the drapery defining the booth space. Anything suspended from pipe may not exceed five (5) lbs. in weight. All exhibits are limited to a height of 8', unless otherwise approved by the Fair Board. Sides may carry background height to within 2' of front line of booth. The front 2' of space may not have any equipment or display over 42" high.

2. Set-up will be Saturday 9:00-10:00 a.m. All booths **must** be completed and exhibits in place by 10:00 a.m.

3. Tear-down is Saturday, 5:00-8:00 p.m. Anything left in the building after 8:00 p.m. will become property of Tony's Pizza Events Center.

4. The Art Show hours are 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and booths **must** be in operation for the entirety of the show.

5. Exhibitors are not permitted to install machinery that might be objectionable in sound or endanger the safety of patrons. The use of public address, amplifiers, or other attention devices or systems by exhibitors will not be permitted.

6. Exhibitors will keep their exhibits, equipment, and demonstrations within their defined booth area. No demonstrations or soliciting in the aisle.

7. All electrical needs will be charged (\$10) to the exhibitor and must be marked on the contract. Exhibitors must provide their own extension cords, etc.

8. Booth fees (without added electrical fees, see #7): \$25 per space. NO REFUNDS AFTER JULY 1st, for any reason.

9. Exhibitors are responsible for unloading and loading of goods and must have the ability to do so without assistance.

10. Exhibitors are responsible for the security of their booths and contents.

11. The Saline County Fair Association TRI-RIVERS FAIR is not liable for loss or damage to any exhibit.

EXHIBIT SELECTION IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE FAIR BOARD AND WE HAVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE.
