### **Check-in:**

-To exhibit in this department, bring the item(s) to be exhibited to Kenwood Hall on **Tuesday, July 28<sup>th</sup>, between 7:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.**

### **Check-out:**

**-Kenwood Hall will close to the public at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday.**

**-All exhibits must remain on display until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. NO EARLY RELEASES.** Any exhibitor who removes an entry early will forfeit his/her premium check and will not be allowed to exhibit for three years.

**-Exhibits and premium checks must be picked up in Kenwood Hall on Sunday, between 5:00 and 7:00 p.m.**

**-Pick up your premium check BEFORE picking up your exhibits. All exhibits must be checked out with the division superintendents or assistants before removal.**

-If entries are left after 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, arrangements must be made with the Fair Office (fairtririversoffice@gmail.com). Any remaining items will be disposed of after Aug. 31<sup>st</sup>. (Perishable items will only be kept until 7:00 p.m. on the last day of the fair.)

### **Reminders:**

**-All entries must have been made since the last Tri-Rivers Fair, therefore any entry that has been previously exhibited at the Tri-Rivers Fair cannot be entered again.**

**-Only one entry per class allowed in EVERY division.**

**-4-H members may NOT enter in Division 19 or Division 20.**

**-Do not tear apart entry cards.**

**-No professionals (anyone with a sales tax number or who teaches) may enter, unless otherwise stated.**

-If you have questions about entering an exhibit, contact the Department Chairperson, Linda Lecklider, (785) 452-5775 or the Division Superintendent.

*- Superintendents: Any potential changes to divisions must be proposed, in writing, to the Department Chairperson (Linda Lecklider) following the fair, no later than September 30<sup>th</sup>. The proposed changes will be reviewed for the following fair. No changes (classes, rules, awards, etc.) may be made after that time and without the Department Chair's approval.*

**Best of Show Awards:** Judges will select **one item** to receive “Best of Show” in **each division**. Best of Show winners will receive a rosette ribbon, sponsored by the Tri-Rivers Fair Board.

### Best of Show – Rosette Ribbon (sponsored by the Tri-Rivers Fair Board)

All entries must have been preserved since the last Tri-Rivers Fair.

Previous Best of Show winners are not eligible to win Best of Show for one year.

Recipes and processing methods from the sources below must be used. Recipes must be from 1995-present and must be adjusted for altitude based on your processing location or it will be disqualified. Processing methods that will be disqualified include: open kettle- canning, oven canning, sun canning, and using electric multi-cookers. Untested recipes will be disqualified for food safety reasons. Tested recipe resources include:

Each exhibit must be sealed in a clean, clear, standard canning jar, with matching brand two-piece lids. No colored jars, fancy padded lids, fabric over wraps or cozies. No fancy packs unless recipe states to do so (ex: pickled asparagus). For food safety reasons, the size of jars used must not be larger than the jar size stated in the recipe. Note: There are 12-ounce, 24-ounce, and 28-ounce canning jars available and may be used. Use pint jar process recommendations for 12-ounce jars. Use quart jar process recommendations for 24 ounce and 28-ounce jars.

Each exhibit must have the complete recipe and instructions attached with the entry card or it will be disqualified. Recipe must include exhibitor name, recipe source, date of publication, and altitude where it was processed. If using Mrs. Wage's or Ball mixes, indicate the date the mix was purchased. Alcohol is not allowed as an ingredient in food preservation entries. Dried products must also include the recipe, preparation steps, and heating instructions. All meat jerky must be heated to an internal temperature of 160 degrees F before or after drying. This is not the drying temperature. Jerky not heated to an internal temperature of 160 degrees F will be disqualified. Heating information can be found in "Dry Meat Safely at Home" [www.ksre.ksu.edu/bookstore/pubs/MF3173.pdf](http://www.ksre.ksu.edu/bookstore/pubs/MF3173.pdf). **Use a rubber band to attach the entry card and recipe around the top of the jar.**

**Each jar must be labeled with the following: product, name of exhibitor, method of preservation, processing time, pressure (psi), altitude where processed, date processed (month and year).** The label must not cover brand name of jar. Do not write on the jars or lids, only on the labels.

**Entries not adhering to the rules will NOT be judged.**

Example: Canned Fruit must be four (4) different types of fruit.
